An award of \$4,000 will be presented to a student who will be a full-time, upper-division student enrolled as an SJSU Aviation degree major in the Fall Semester of 2016. Applicants must be maintaining an overall college G.P.A. of 2.5 and have a strong interest in aviation, preferably with a goal of becoming an airline pilot.

History, Meaning and Significance of this Award

The memorial fund is named after Vincent E. Morine, who was born in California in 1949. When Vince, and his twin brother, Victor, were just small children, the Morine family moved to Honolulu. Vince received his high school education in Honolulu and started his flying lessons while on the Islands. Vincent returned to California to attend Foothill College and San José State University's School of Aeronautics, graduating from SJSU in 1971.

While in college, Vince continued flying, working for Hawaiian Air Tour Service, Trans-Isle Airlines, Aloha Airlines, Hawaii Pacific Airlines and Panorama Airlines in Hawaii; Valley Airlines in San Jose; Air California in Newport Beach, as First Officer on the Boeing 737; and, finally, as a pilot with American Airlines, assigned as Flight Engineer on the Boeing 727.

Vincent Morine died in an airplane crash on the Island of Hawaii on April 11, 1974. In his all too short life, Vince had accumulated over 6,000 hours of flying time and, while just 25 years of age, had already earned the Airline Transport Pilot and Flight Engineer FAA licenses.

A wide circle of family and friends created a living memorial in Vince's name, originally entitled the "Vincent E. Morine Memorial Fund Scholarship". The original purpose of the fund was to award a scholarship to a person whose dedication, life and ideals reflected, to a reasonable degree, the spirit of a life of the man for whom it was named. Over the years, all recipients of the Morine Scholarship have held distinguished careers in aviation, further honoring the life and spirit of Vincent Morine.

Recently, the scholarship was redesigned and renamed the "Vincent E. Morine Memorial Fund." The semiannual distribution from the endowment fund is now provided to the non-profit, student managed, Flying Twenty, Inc., flight club to help students defray the ever-increasing costs of flying. With the awarding of the Vincent E. Morine Memorial Fund, it is the desire of the donor that student members secure flying time at the lowest possible hourly rates and continue to pursue their love of aviation.

The Flying 20 Flight Club was originally formed in San Jose in 1936 with a membership of twenty enthusiastic flyers. Club membership is open to San José State University students, faculty, and alumni. The club operates with the intent of promoting flying and aviation safety while keeping costs to a minimum. The club's aircraft and hangar are located at the Reid-Hillview Airport in San Jose, California. The club provides an annual report of the use of the funds.

The Vincent E. Morine Memorial Fund (the endowment) is managed under the policies of the Board of Directors of the Tower Foundation and San José State University. It is the responsibility of the Tower Foundation and the donor to apply the Fund for the purposes of honoring the spirit of the life, ideals, love of aviation, and dedication of the man for whom it was named: Vincent E. Morine.
